Reflection and Relocation

Here at Hope of Glory Ministries, the end of 2013 came quickly with an amazing and favorable move to our new location at 103 E. Arlington Blvd. Reflecting on this relocation brings memories of packing and unloading, long days of laughs and frustrations, and many laborers who partnered with us to make the transition as smooth as possible. We are thankful to our Father in heaven for his mercy during this time and bringing others alongside of us to assist in the needs of the move!

In 2013 our Resource Center we served 3,891 families which consisted of over 13,266 people. In addition we served an estimated 11,453 families through our Matthew 25 Project which we ended in July in anticipation of our move. During the Thanksgiving holiday three area churches partnered with us to serve 500 meals to our neighbors in Kearney Park, Moyewood, and Hopkins Park. Our Christmas partnership with over 15 local churches and families allowed us to provide Christmas gifts for 40 families throughout Pitt County. By God's grace we had the privilege to walk with 9 new brothers and sisters in Christ who responded to the Good News, repented and believed in Jesus as Savior and Lord, while 8 others rededicated their lives to our King! We are confident that this eternal impact comes from those of you who donate your time, goods and gifts to the work of the ministry!

We are also pleased to report that our Community Outlet is now up and running six days a week to serve our local community by offering them low cost options for their basic needs. Our resource center services will continue on an appointment and emergency basis including the distribution of food, clothing, and household goods at no cost. HOGM will continue to depend on the community for donated items and volunteers to serve weekly.

Items available at the store for sale include clothing for men, women, and children, shoes, household items and furniture. Store hours are Monday-Friday from 9:00am-5:00pm, and Saturdays 10:00am-4:00pm. Donations of items are also accepted during open hours. Purchases made at the Community Outlet provide much needed supplemental funds for the food pantry, life skills and job training classes, materials for discipleship ministries and other ministry operations.

Lastly, as we venture into 2014 and continue to seek the Holy Spirit's direction for the ministry we are praying for laborers of the harvest. We find in the book of Luke as Jesus began to send out his disciples to carry on the Gospel message, he tells them "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few. Therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest." Our prayer here at HOGM is that our Father would send laborers; believers who desire to make the gospel of Jesus known to those in Pitt County and the world around them. Together as laborers we are able to truly live into the call of our salvation and respond to the command we see in scripture to "Go, and make disciples...". The "mission" to share the Good News continues because "worship" our Jesus does not exist all throughout the world. Will you join us as prayer warriors for these laborers and pray through your impact on the harvest of Pitt County? As we continue to grow in 2014 we are leaning on the power of the Holy Spirit and the relationships He is creating all around us so that we would speak the truth of Jesus and be fruitful ministers of reconciliation. To Him be the Glory, Amen!

A word from our Co-founders

We trust this letter finds you doing well and experiencing God's unconditional love and peace in a very personal way! It has been a true blessing to see all the recent transitions that have been taking place at HOGM. Transition in leadership, transition in location and transition in ministry methods. We are as committed as ever to feeding the hungry, clothing the needy and sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ! However, we are doing it with a new Executive Director, at a new location, and the way we do it has a new look with new initiatives taking place.

Our new leader, Mandi Stewart, is just plain getting it done. She hit the road running as soon as she got here this past May. She has a sincere heart for Jesus, a compassion for people in need, a can-do attitude, and the leadership skills and qualities it takes to lead our community outreach ministry. For those that don't know her, she was quite the softball player growing up and played for ECU in college. She also has coaching experience at the college level as well as one-on-one training with many area softball players. She understands both what it means to Coach and play your position well. She understands the power of teamwork and that great teammates make great teams! We could not be any prouder of her and the job she is doing!

Our new location, 103 E. Arlington Boulevard, has been an excellent move for us. When the Tenth Street Road Connector Project was a done deal and we knew we had to move, we were not too happy about it. Over about a 12 month period, we searched for and prayed over many locations. Then a friend of our ministry and commercial real estate agent, Buddy Holt, called about this location. I must be straight with you, I was familiar with this building but not really feeling it, and told Buddy I did not think it would be a good fit. Praise God he called me back in about a week and stated he really thought we should take a look at it. Reluctantly I agreed. Lisa and I went to view it and wouldn't you know the Holy Spirit gave us a witness in our hearts and a vision for this place that we are now seeing fulfilled. Next we had Mandi and Tony join us to view the property. We didn't tell them our thoughts at all but wanted a pure perspective from them. Guess what? Yes they also had a witness in their hearts and a vision for HOGM here. God blessed us to work with the Carlton Taylor family and they were very generous and supportive and played a pivotal role in our purchase of this property. A big Thank You to the Taylor family! We had some renovation work done by our friends at Custom Building Company and it turned out just great. There were some trade-offs with our new location. Our warehouse is much smaller but we are making adjustments to deal with this challenge. For instance, we have a long haul truck trailer parked at our dock for extra storage space. Please stop by to see our new facilities and learn more about what is happening at HOGM!

Our new ministry methods and initiatives were sparked with the opening of the Community Outlet in late October which serves as an additional component to our outreach ministry. Doors are opened six days per week and we are seeing traffic steadily increase as the word gets out more and more. We are providing low cost options to help our neighbors purchase such things as clothes, shoes, household goods, furniture and appliances. We are deeply appreciative to each of you that donates these items to HOGM! We could not do this without your generosity and support! Our Healthy Help initiative is a focused effort to bring in better quality and nutritional food items that we distribute to those in need. There is a lot of research on this topic for food pantries and Mandi is doing her part to get this message out locally. We also have a new recreational ministry starting in March that will get kids out to exercise and learn sports and hear about the Good News of Jesus Christ! We will soon be offering some other classes in our facility that will help those who are struggling in everyday life to learn practical life skills that can help them get back on their feet. These are some new initiatives to better serve our community but we have the same heart and mission to reach our neighbors with the life changing message of the Gospel!

Thank you very much for your support! Many of you have stood with us since 2001 when we first started HOGM. So many people have given of their time, talents and treasure to help us impact our community! We appreciate your continued partnership as we fulfill our local mission. Ministry Information and Ways to Serve:

Resource Center Services:

Our in-house Resource Center is open five days a week and provides food, clothing, and household items to people in our community that are in need due to limited or no income, or in a crisis situation. Appointments are taken every Friday at 9am by calling 252-215-9042 and speaking with Mr. Tony to schedule a time for the following week. Other emergencies, fire victims and homeless individuals are served on an as need basis daily.

“Healthy Help” Food Drives:

Our food pantry is always in need of donated items. Over this past year, we have implemented a shift in our food pantry strategy. “Healthy Help” seeks to radically and holistically serve low-income families in Pitt County by providing healthier options for families through our Food Pantry and educate them on preventive healthy lifestyle choices, along with educating those who compassionately donate items to mindfully contribute healthier nutritional foods. Will you join us in hosting a food drive?

Community Outreaches:

During the past eleven years, we have partnered with a diverse group of area churches and ministered in a local low income public housing community. On Saturdays throughout the year, we set-up our 40x60 tent, bring in sound system, and most importantly, our ministry teams. We have a children’s outreach with a clear presentation of the gospel of Jesus Christ. Lunch is then served while relationships are built until later in the afternoon. We then have our adult outreach, which consists of praise & worship and the preaching of God’s Word. Here again, we see people make commitments to Christ.

Weekly outreaches this spring include a recreational ministry to the Kearney Park neighborhood using athletics and creative arts to minister to the children on a regular basis. Every Thursday (beginning March 7th and every other Saturday during the spring we, along with other partnering ministries, spend time teaching sports and sharing God’s word with the children and families.
